The Southwest Florida Water Management District has extended the declared Modified Phase III Water Shortage. Until **October 1st, 2026**, unless otherwise noted:

One-day-a-week watering remains in effect.

Watering hours have been changed to 12:01 am - 4:00 am OR 8:00 p.m. - 11:59 pm.

Hand watering, microirrigation, and other low volume irrigation must take place before 8 am or after 6 pm.

At-home car washing is only allowed on your watering day.

Aesthetic water fixtures (like fountains) are limited to 4 hours.

Pressure washing only in preparation for painting or sealing is allowed.

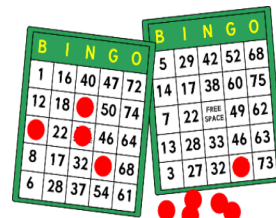

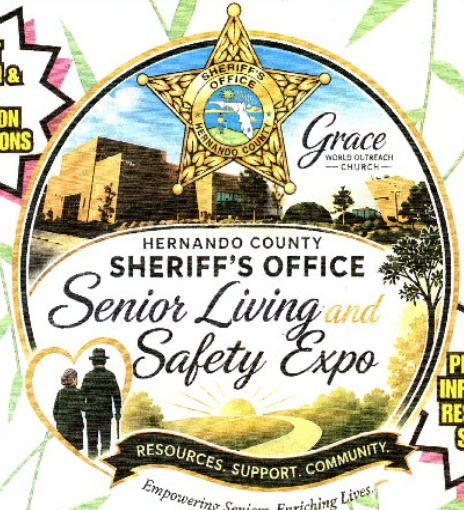

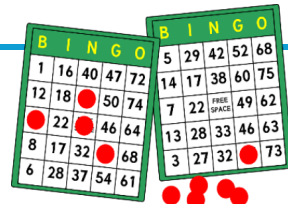

Landscaping Tips - September 2026

By Tom Anderson, Univ. of Florida Master Gardener

"Dividing Bulbs and Perennials, Bedding Plants, Vegetables, Hernando County Fertilizer Ban, Hurricane Preparation, Free Classes, Garden Club Annual Tomato contest, and High Point Beauty Spot of the Month Winner"

According to the University of Florida Extension Service **September** is a Great time to **Divide and Replant Bulbs and Perennials** that have grown too large or need rejuvenation. Add organic material to the planting areas. See: *Seeds and Propagation (Lawn & Garden)*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_garden_propagation

Bedding Plants – Coleus, Celosia, Zinnia, and Wax Begonias are good choices for bedding color in the fall. September is the time to remove spent blooms, to cut back, and fertilize flowering annuals and perennials to extend the flowering season into the fall months. For additional information: *Annuals* http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_annual_landscaping_plants

Vegetables – Time to start planting the fall cool season vegetables such as Lettuce, Collards, Celery, and Cabbage. Go to: *Vegetable Gardening in Florida*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_vegetable_gardening

Hernando County Turf Fertilizer Ban is still in effect until **Oct. 1st**, when residents may apply Nitrogen(N) based turf fertilizers through **December 14th**. Ref: **Hernando County Ordinance – Sec.28-505 to 28-519**

Hurricane Season is usually the most active in September and October. Make sure that you remove the dead branches from your trees and that you have a plan to protect your hanging and potted plants. **Be Prepared!!**

The Master Gardener Nursery, 19490 Oliver St., Brooksville, is open 8 AM – 11 Wed & Sat (weather permitting) for sales (cash or check only) as well as assistance/questions. Oliver Street is East off US 41 just North of the Hernando County Fair Grounds.

UF/IFAS Extension Office, Hernando County, 16110 Aviation Loop Dr., is open and Master Gardeners are available for gardening questions 9 – 4 or call 352-754-4433. Webinar classes and activities are available. More info at: <http://hernandoextension.com>

Where were you on September 11, 2001?

On a clear Tuesday morning at 8:46AM, terror came to our shores. A Boeing 767 loaded with passengers and fuel was flown into the North Tower of the World Trade center in New York City, NY. 18 minutes later, a second Boeing 767 slammed into the South Tower.

At 9:37AM, as the stunned world watched these horrific events play out on live television, a third plane, a Boeing 757 flew into the Pentagon, the headquarters of the Department of Defense, in Washington, D.C.

California-bound United Airlines Flight 93 was hijacked about 40 minutes after departing Newark Liberty International Airport in New Jersey. Passengers learned from loved ones on the ground of the morning's events in New York and Washington, D.C., and knew they had to do something, anything. Heroic passengers attempted to overtake the hijackers. After praying over the phone with a GTE airphone supervisor, Todd Beamer asked her to tell his family he loved them, then uttered these now infamous words to his fellow passengers; "Are you ready? OK, Let's roll". Flight 93 crashed into a field in Shanksville Pennsylvania at 10:02AM.

At 9:59AM, the South Tower of the World Trade Center collapsed.

At 10:28AM, the North Tower of the World Trade Center collapsed.

Almost 3,000 innocent lives were taken on September 11, 2001. Passengers, crew, military, civilian, police, fire, rescue....

The United States of America has been targeted many times by foreign governments and fanatical religious terrorists going back to the Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, and the Mexican American War.
