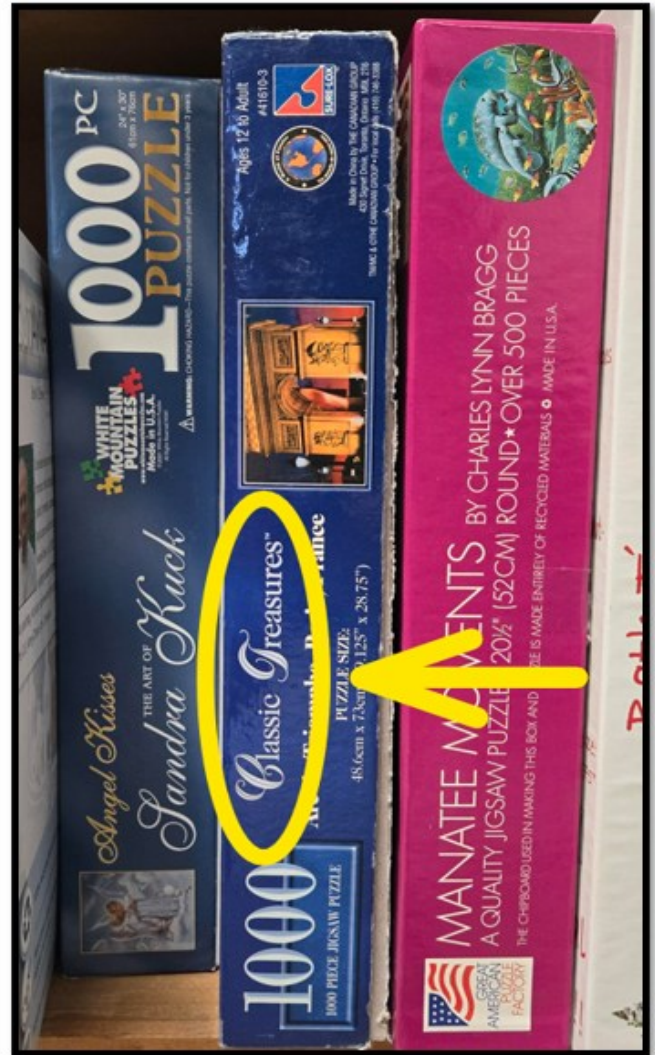
We have some new cruises for 2026 and 2027, so come out to one of our meetings to learn more!

Landscaping Tips April 2026

“Annuals, Good Insects, Vegetables, Lawn mowing, Earth Day, Gardening help , and High Point Beauty Spot of the Month”

“Gardening requires lots of water – Most of it in the form of Perspiration.” - Anon

Annuals - According to the University of Florida Service Extension, April is time to start planting **annuals**. In our Central Florida area, annuals usually only last one season (not one year). Annuals need to be planted at the appropriate time of the year to thrive, but they are sometimes sold out of season, resulting in a shorter lifespan in the garden. Warm season (tender) annuals damaged by frosts should be planted after the last frost date. The most important thing when selecting annuals is to determine the amount of sunlight the plants will receive. See chart: *Annuals* - http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_annual_landscape_plants

You should identify **Beneficial Insects** like Lady Beetles (Bugs) to conserve them before applying insecticides. They help eliminate bad insects. See *Beneficial Insects*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_beneficial_insects

Continue to plant **Vegetables** like beans, sweet corn, and squash . Mulch well to help prevent weeds and to retain soil moisture. See: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_vegetable_gardening

It is time to get your lawnmower ready. Make sure your Mower blade is sharp, and your deck is clean/level. Change/check your oil and filters as required. Also remember:

Do Not Mow Low, Do Not cut more than a third of the Turf Blade, and Do Not Bag, grass clippings can be left on the lawn. **Grass Clippings Do Not Contribute to Thatch**. Recommended cutting heights:

St. Augustine/Floritam & Bahia - 3-4 inches, Empire Zoysia grass - 2-3 inches

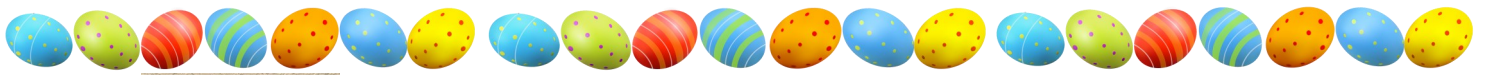
