

## Landscaping Tips - February 2026

By Tom Anderson, University of Florida Master Gardener

### **“Bulbs, Annuals, Azaleas, Vegetables, Roses, Pre-emergence Herbicides, Gardening Help/Classes, and High Point Garden Spot of the Month**

*“To forget how to dig the earth and to tend the soil is to forget ourselves.” – Mahatma Gandhi*

According to the University of Florida Extension Service **Bulbs** you can plant now including Amazon Lily, Crinum, and Agapanthus (African Lily/Lily of the Nile). Provide adequate water to establish. Mulch to protect from the cold. Go to: *Bulbs for Florida* - [http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic\\_bulbous\\_flowers](http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_bulbous_flowers)

**Annuals/Bedding** plants that do well in cooler months are petunia, pansy, verbena, dianthus, strawflower, and lobelia. See: *“Annuals”* – [http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu?topic\\_annual\\_landscape\\_plants](http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu?topic_annual_landscape_plants)

With **Azaleas** in Bloom, now is the time to select varieties to add to the landscape. Go to: *Azaleas* - [http://ifas.ufl.edu/topic\\_azalea](http://ifas.ufl.edu/topic_azalea)

Start the following warm season **Vegetables** as Transplants: Tomatoes, Beans, Peppers, Cucumbers and Squash. Do not plant in the outdoor garden until there is no danger of freezing temperatures, usually around mid-March. Prune **Roses** this month to reduce and improve the overall form. You should see new blooms in 8-9 wks. See: *Roses* - [http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic\\_rose](http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_rose)

The most effective way to start your annual control of **Lawn Weeds** is to apply a “pre-emergent” herbicide (not a weed and feed) to your lawn before the weed seeds germinate and get reestablished. In our area this is usually around mid-February after the last frost and, when day temperatures reach 65-70 degrees for 4-5 days. Look for products that contain the active ingredients **oryzalin, benefin, pendimethalin, benefin + oryzalin, DCPA or bensulide**. Provide adequate soil moisture before and after application to activate most “pre-emergent” herbicides. **Follow herbicide label instructions carefully.** (Note: Good pre-emergent herbicides are only available at landscaping stores or online.)
