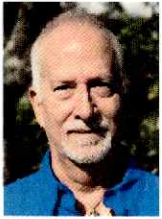

Garden Club Article for November 2025

Landscaping Tips

"Bedding Plants, Bulbs/Perennials, Vegetables, Irrigation Systems, Gardening Questions, and High Point Fall Craft Fair."

"A garden is never so good as it will be next year." – Anon

The Pansy, Viola, Snapdragon, Dianthus, Cape Daisy, Alyssum, and Petunias are cool season plants that you may use to create a display of fall colors in your flower beds according to the University of Florida Extension Service. Viola flowers are smaller in size compared to pansies. The viola typically has four petals pointing upward and one downward, while the pansy has two petals upward and three downward. Violas are more heat and cold tolerant. See: *Annuals*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_annual_landscape_plants

Bulbs and Perennials – Bulbs that like to get their start in cool weather include Amaryllis, Crinum, and Daylily. It is also time to divide and replant overgrown Bulbs and Perennials so that they establish before the wintry weather arrives. Vegetables – November is a good month to start planting Lettuce, Kale, Cabbage, Broccoli, Beets, and Carrots. Go to: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_vegetablegardening

Irrigation Systems during the cooler winter months may not be necessary and it is acceptable to hand water plants when needed. http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_landscape_irrigation

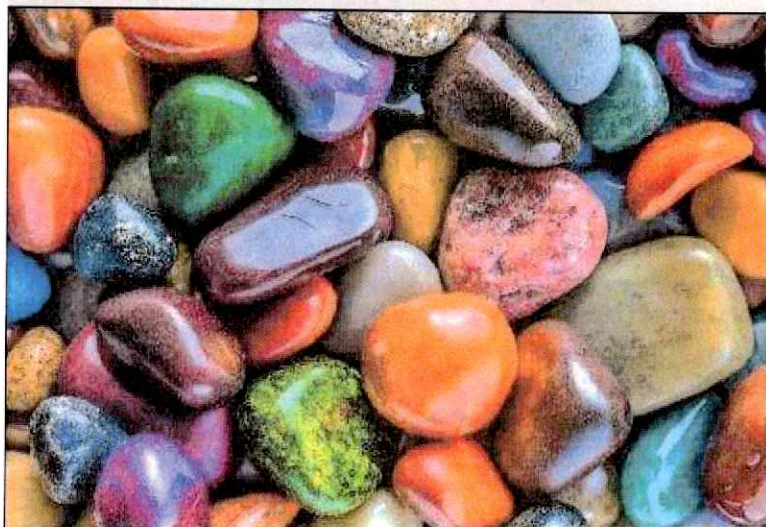

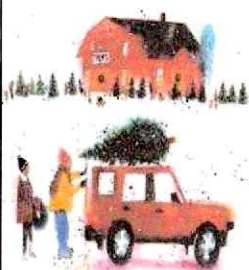

Top Speed	Greater than 20 mph, but not more than 25 mph.	Not capable of exceeding 20 mph.
Registration, Title, and Insurance	Must be titled, registered, and insured, just like a regular motor vehicle.	Not required for registration or insurance, though highly recommended.
Required Safety Features	Must have extensive safety equipment, including: • Headlights, taillights, and brake lights • Turn signals • Seat belts for all passengers • A VIN and a windshield • Rearview mirrors • A parking brake	Standard equipment required includes: • Efficient brakes • Reliable steering and safe tires • A rearview mirror • Red reflectorized warning devices on front and rear
Where to Drive	Can operate on public streets with a posted speed limit of 35 mph or less. Can cross a road with a higher speed limit	Can operate on designated roads where the speed limit is 30 mph or less. A specific designation was made for
Driver's License	A valid driver's license is required to operate an LSV.	For driving on public roads, operators under 18 must have a learner's permit or license. Operators 18 and older
Driving Time	Can be operated at any time, day or night, since they are equipped for road use.	Limited to operation between sunrise and sunset unless additional safety equipment is installed.

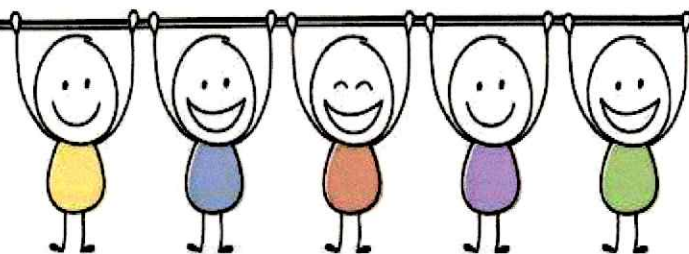

There is a drop box slot in the “Employees Only” door on the south corner of the building, just around the corner from the Office entry, or you may bring the keys to the office at 9:00AM on the next business day. Thank you.

Sound system: If you use the sound system for an event, return the equipment to the condition you found it. If you push buttons or adjust volume, or any other settings, return them to their original position. As with keys, there may be someone who needs to use that system the next day and the system needs to be ready to go.

RV Compound: The HOA has purchased stickers to place on stored items to indicate payment has been made, and the office has proof of registration and insurance. ALL vehicles and/or trailers MUST have current registration, proof of insurance, and be paid in full or be subject to towing at the vehicle owner’s expense. Also, 2026 payments will need to be made to the office by February 1, 2026.

Golf Cart 2026 stickers are available in the office. Reminder, all golf carts in the community must be registered with the office and have current insurance.

Kitchen clean-up: Big “thank you” to the determined group of volunteers who re-organized the kitchen. You can only imagine how much stuff has accumulated in the kitchen over these many years, and there may not have been a real rhyme or reason as to where all that stuff was stashed. Well, not anymore! Cabinets and drawers are labeled and all the stuff and supplies have been categorized and organized. Thank you so much for your Herculean efforts to improve the community for all residents.

Assessment payments: As mentioned above, there is a mail drop box slot in the Baltic office Employee entrance. If you don’t need a receipt and you want to save your self a little time, you are welcome to drop your payment in that drop box. And if you REALLY want to save yourself time, you can sign up for automatic payments on our portal through the High Point website, <https://www.highpointbrooksville.net> and click on the “HOA Payments” link. If you have any questions about the portal or for help signing up, give us a call or stop by the office. Also, remember, any payment which is not in the office before 3:00PM on the 10th of each month is subject to late fees.
