

Landscaping Tips

By Tom Anderson, Univ. of Florida Master Gardener "Annuals, Poinsettias, Good Insects, Vegetables, Lawn mowing, and Earth Day" "Gardening is the purest of human pleasures." – Francis Bacon

Annuals - According to the University of Florida Service Extension, April is a great time to start planting **annuals**. In our Central Florida area, annuals usually only last one season (not one year). To be successful, annuals must be planted at the right time of the year, but unfortunately they are sometimes sold out of season and are therefore short-lived in the garden. Annuals are divided into two types: warm season and cool season. Warmseason (tender) annuals are damaged by frosts/freezes and should be planted after the last frost date. The most important thing when selecting annuals is to determine how much sunlight the plants will receive. See the chart in the following: *Annuals* -

Potted **Poinsettias** can be kept in pots or transplanted outside as the temperatures are warming. Trim the fading bracts and leave 4-6 inches of the stem on each branch. Start the transplant in a partially shaded area and once it has acclimated to the outdoors, it can be permanently planted in an area of full sun. **Poinsettias** do well in our area of Florida but must be trimmed back in the spring and late summer to prevent them from becoming too leggy. Beneficial Insects like Lady Beetles (Bugs) should be identified and conserved before applying insecticides. They help eliminate the bad insects. See *Beneficial Insects*: <u>http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_beneficial_insects</u>

Vegetables that should continue to be planted are beans, sweet corn, and squash. Mulch well to help prevent weeds and to retain soil moisture. See: <u>http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_vegetable_gardening</u>

Don't forget to get your lawnmower ready. Make sure your blade is sharp, your mower deck is clean and level. Change/check your oil and filters. Also remember: **Don't Mow Low, Don't cut more than 1/3 of the Turf Blade, and Don't Bag,** grass clippings can be left on the lawn, <u>Grass Clippings Do Not Contribute to Thatch</u>. Recommended cutting heights are:

St.Augustine/Floratam & Bahia 3-4 inches, Empire Zoysia grass 2-3 inches.

"<u>Earth Day</u>" was started on April 22, 1970 by Sen. Gaylord Nelson, WI, to raise awareness of environmental issues In April 1971 Pres. Nixon celebrated the 1st anniversary of "Earth Day" with a proclamation establishing "Earth Week".

The 3rd Annual Hernando County Florida-Friendly "Earth Day" Celebration will be held on April 20nd, 9 AM til Noon at the UF/IFAS Extension Master Gardener Nursery, 19490 Oliver St., Brooksville. There will be many Booths including a Kids Booth with mosaics and face painting. Presentations will be made on Recycling and Water Conservation, Native Plants, and Pollinators. The times of the workshops will be 9 – 10:15 & 11 AM. Florida-Friendly and Native plants will be available for purchase (Check or Cash only).

The Master Gardener Nursery is open 8:30 – 12, Wed & Sat (weather permitting) for sales (cash or check only) & assistance/questions. Oliver Street is East off US 41 just North of the Hernando County Fair Grounds.

If you are familiar with the card game gin rummy, you have a head start understanding Mah Jongg. There are differences, of course, but it is the same general idea. Instead of cards, in Mah Jongg, you mix and pick tiles. You arrange tiles in combinations for a hand and take turns to pick and discard tiles to make a hand.

Mah Jongg requires four players, while gin rummy requires two. Gin, like Chinese Mah Jongg, allows the player to make up runs and combinations for a hand, that's not the case in American Mah Jongg.

The Blvd now has 20 mph signs posted from Little Tee to Diplomacy, due to curves so be mindful of this change and drive with care. This is patrolled by the Sheriff's Dept. And tickets can be given. Also, please remember that all golf carts must be registered in the office and can ONLY be on our roads from sunrise to sunset, regardless of whether you have lights or not. As of October 2023, Florida's golf cart laws require drivers under 18 to have a learner's permit, and drivers 18 and older to have valid government-issued identification to drive golf carts on public roads.

To all of our snowbirds getting close to the time when you will be going north, we'll miss all of you and wish everyone a safe trip. We'll see you in the fall. Meanwhile, those of us who remain will keep the home fires (and A/C) burning.
